

Title: Developing Interventions for Health-Enhancing Physical Activity

Status: now accepting applications

Closing date to apply: September 07, 2017

Funding Maximum: N/A

This funding opportunity is currently accepting applications for phased innovation grant awards to support highly innovative research aimed at developing multi-level interventions that will increase health-enhancing physical activity: 1) in persons or groups who can benefit from such activity; and 2) that can be made scalable and sustainable for broad use across the nation. This opportunity provides support for up to two years for research planning activities and feasibility studies, followed by a possible transition to expanded research support.
